### MA APCD Calendar Years 2021 and 2022

- Available for request
- Applicants with approved projects that require updated MA APCD data (CY 2021 Data or CY2022) should submit to CHIA a completed Exhibit B (Certificate of Continued Need and Compliance) of the Data Use Agreement. After submitting a completed Exhibit B, you will receive an invoice (if applicable) for the requested data. Upon payment of the invoice the order for the data will be placed.
- CY 2021 Data includes medical, pharmacy, and dental claims incurred between January 1, 2017, and December 31, 2021, and it includes six (6) months of run-out (paid claims through June 30, 2022). In addition to claims data, the release contains relevant reference files including member eligibility, providers, products, and benefit plans. This data encompasses public and private payers as well as fully-insured and self-insured plans. Keep in mind that due to the Supreme Court decision, Gobeille v. Liberty Mutual, the self-insured plans are severely reduced starting in 2016. This release also includes MassHealth Medicaid data in the MAAPCD for the period of calendar years 2017-2021.

## MA APCD Calendar Years 2021 and 2022 (continued)

- The new CY 2022 Data includes medical, pharmacy, and dental claims incurred from January 1, 2018, through December 31, 2022, and includes six (6) months of run-out (paid claims through June 30, 2023). This release also includes MassHealth Medicaid data in the MA APCD for the period of calendar years 2018-2022. As with CY2021, this data encompasses public and private payers as well as fully-insured and self-insured plans. Again, keep in mind that due to the Supreme Court decision, Gobeille v. Liberty Mutual, the self-insured plans are severely reduced starting in 2016.

#### V. DATASETS REQUESTED

The Massachusetts All-Payer Claims Database ("APCD") is comprised of medical, pharmacy, and dental claims and information from the member eligibility, provider, and product files that are collected from health insurance payers licensed to operate in the Commonwealth of Massachusetts. This information encompasses public and private payers as well as data from fully-insured and self-insured plans. APCD data are refreshed and updated annually and made available to approved data users. For more information about APCD Data, including available years of data and a full list of elements in the database please refer to layouts, data dictionaries and similar documentation included on CHIA's website.

Data requests are typically fulfilled on a one time basis, however; certain Projects may require future years of data that will become available in a subsequent release. Projects that anticipate a need for future years of data may request to be considered for a subscription. Approved subscriptions will receive, upon request, the <u>same data files and data elements</u> included in the initial Release annually or as available. Please note that approved subscription requests are subject to the Data Use Agreement, and subject to the limitation that the Data can be used only in support of the approved Project.


In addition, the December 2023 revision to MA APCD application specifies that the member ZIP code geographic data is now only released at the level of one ZIP code per person per year based on the member's ZIP code reported in the member's earliest submission year month.

One ZIP Code per person (MEID) per year has been assigned based on the ZIP code/state reported in the member eligibility record's earliest submission year month. If the record does not have an MEID, assignment is based on distinct OrgID/Carrier Specific Unique Member ID.

# Question: What is the total size of the data extract for the MA APCD CY 2021 subscription?



**Answer:** This answer pertains to this user's specific extract.



Question: What is the size of the largest file if the extract consists of multiple files?

#### Answer:

- One file is created per file type regardless of the size.
- One thing to remember about the size, the number of lines (rows) and size could differ based on the number of buy-ups and data elements requested, despite requesting the same number of years on an application.
- As shown in the user specific question above.

# <u>Question</u>: Could you confirm whether the data is formatted as asterisk-delimited text files?



**Answer**: The data is asterisk delimited.

Question: Is the data compressed?

**Answer**: No. The data is not compressed.

<u>Question</u>: How many files are included in the CY 2021 APCD data extract if we subscribe to <u>Medical Claims</u>, <u>Member Eligibility</u>, <u>Provider</u>, <u>Product</u>, and <u>Medicaid Data?</u>

<u>Answer:</u> There are 4 files. The Medicaid related data is included in each of the files. If you also subscribe to the MassHealth Enhanced Eligibility (MHEE) data, the MHEE data is sent as a separate file.

Question: Our research focuses on analyzing inpatient psychiatric care using the MA APCD medical claims file. Which variables within the MA APCD can be utilized to filter for inpatient psychiatric care?


Inpatient Psychiatric Hospital Medical Claims

<u>Answer</u>: There are several fields with coding options for inpatient psychiatric hospitals. The National Uniform Claim Committee (NUCC) maintains service provider taxonomy code as part of a system used to classify health care providers by specialty and area of practice. Both the MA APCD medical claims table and the MA APCD provider table have dedicated fields for reporting the service provider specialty using the NUCC taxonomy codes.

### The taxonomy code for an inpatient psychiatric hospital is 283Q00000X.

This taxonomy code is reported in two MA APCD fields <u>MC032</u> (Service Provider Specialty) and <u>PV022</u> (Taxonomy).







<u>Answer (continued)</u>: When you click on the NPI listings for the Department of Mental Health, the DVA, Holyoke Capital JV, LLC, or HVL Corporation, you will see the hospital name **as shown below**. This is important to note because in the MA APCD, at the medical claim line level, there will be instances where the umbrella government agency or corporate entity is listed as the billing or service provider organization associated the NPI.



<u>Answer (continued)</u>: There will be instances where acute care hospitals are in your search results for psychiatric hospitals. In those instances, the hospital is licensed with multiple taxonomies, such as Lemuel Shattuck Hospital. When you click on its NPI detail listing, you will see it also has the taxonomy of a psychiatric hospital **as shown below**.

<u>Answer (continued)</u>: Both acute care and psychiatric hospitals can have licensed psychiatric beds. The utilization of beds can be determined in the MA APCD by accommodation codes in the revenue code field. The most common accommodation revenue codes used by inpatient psychiatric hospitals are **listed below in Table 1** 

Inpatient Psychiatric Hospital Medical Claims

It is important to keep in mind that not all inpatient stays will have an accommodation revenue codes. Different payment arrangement models, such as capitation models, global payment models, bundled payments or value-based care models for ACOs, do not necessarily require a medical claim bill include full listing through revenue codes. <u>Answer (continued)</u>: When analyzing inpatient psychiatric care by bed capacity, the Massachusetts Department of Mental Health (DMH) has a helpful document which lists psychiatric beds licensed by DMH (updated 12/2023) by DMH at:

<u>Answer (continued)</u>: There are other fields in the MA APCD medical claims, such as the **Type of Facility** (MC245), which have a coding option for inpatient psychiatric facilities. **See below**. You could use this field to filter for inpatient psychiatric claims with the recommendation this field be used in combination with the specialty field. For example, **WHERE** typeoffacility = '8' **OR** serviceproviderspecialty = '283Q00000X'.

Inpatient Psychiatric Hospital Medical Claims

Whenever you are uncertain about which MA APCD field to use in a query, consult the filing threshold detailed in CHIA's MA APCD filing specifications (see: <a href="https://www.chiamass.gov/apcd-data-submission-quides/">https://www.chiamass.gov/apcd-data-submission-quides/</a>). The thresholds in the filing specifications will help you understand the level of completeness expected for that field. For example, the service provider taxonomy (MC032) is required on all claim lines, with a 98% threshold as a category 'A2' which means the data is required to be valid per Conditions and must meet threshold percent with no more than 2% variation. However, while the type of facility (MC245) also has a 98% threshold, it is a category 'B' data element, which means the data is requested and errors are reported but will not cause a file to fail.

<u>Answer (continued)</u>: When analyzing any inpatient care, it is important to note that the magnitude (approximately 85%) of the MA APCD claim lines are for outpatient care. If you are having problems untangling inpatient claim lines from outpatient claim lines, you can test adding one or more filters in the medical claims are more common on inpatient claims as shown below, but again pay close attention to the filing thresholds. Commonly populated means that the field is not always populated.

Question: We've come across negative numbers for paid amount and prepaid amounts. Can you tell us why that is the case? Also, can I ask what is the prepaid amounts?

### **Negative Dollar Amounts**



<u>Answer:</u> Negative dollar amounts in the MA APCD usually indicate adjustments or credits applied to an account. These adjustments can occur for several reasons:

- **Refunds**: Negative amounts can also reflect refunds processed for several reasons, such as overpayment by the patient or insurer, or if a service was canceled and not provided. You might see this in MA APCD pharmacy claims when someone fails to pick up a prescription and medication is returned to supply.
- **Payment Corrections**: If there was an error in the original payment calculation, a negative adjustment might be made to correct the mistake. Sometimes when amounts kick in from copayments, deductibles, or insurance reimbursements, other amounts in the eleven MA APCD currency fields on the medical claim must be corrected.
- Claim Adjustments: Sometimes, after a claim has been processed, adjustments are made based on negotiated rates, policy terms, or after an audit of the services billed. These adjustments can result in negative amounts to align the charges with the agreed-upon rates or policy coverage.
- Overpayment: If an insurance company or patient pays more than the final billed amount for a service, the excess payment is often reflected as a negative amount. This could indicate that the payer is due a refund or that the amount will be credited against future charges. This sometimes happens if a person is dually eligible and a secondary or tertiary payment kicks in.

Also, in the context of negative dollar amounts, pay attention to the <u>Claim Line Type</u> field which indicates whether the field is an <u>amendment</u>, <u>backout</u>, <u>original</u>, <u>replacement</u>, or <u>void</u>. CHIA has incorporated into the MA APCD the <u>Highest Version Paid Indicator</u> is intended only to designate the highest version of a claim line that was PAID. This is the version indicator approved by carriers through discussions with CHIA for MA APCD release and financial analysis purposes. # Answer (continued): With regards to the prepaid amount, see page 10 of the MEDICAID NATIONAL CORRECT CODING INITIATIVE TECHNICAL GUIDANCE MANUAL (see: <a href="https://www.cms.gov/files/document/medicaid-ncci-technical-guidance-manual-03152024.pdf">https://www.cms.gov/files/document/medicaid-ncci-technical-guidance-manual-03152024.pdf</a>), they explain that:

### **Prepaid Amount**



"In a risk-based managed-care arrangement, the state Medicaid agency pays an MCO a **monthly prepaid amount** for each Medicaid enrollee, which covers all or most Medicaid-covered services provided to each enrollee. The MCO may reimburse those who provide covered services to the Medicaid enrollees on an FFS, contract, sub-capitated, or other bundled/global payment basis."

The **prepaid amount** can be used by both Health Maintenance Organizations (HMOs) and Managed Care Organizations (MCOs), where a fixed, upfront fee is paid on a monthly or annual basis. This prepaid amount covers a comprehensive range of healthcare services defined in the member's contract, without requiring significant additional payment at the time of service. The focus is on controlling cost and **ensuring the use of annual (routine) preventive healthcare**, encouraging members to use their prepaid services without the worry of high medical bills for individual visits or treatments.

The prepaid amount allows for more predictable healthcare costs for carriers and members. In exchange, members typically agree to receive care exclusively from providers within the HMO's and MCO's network, except in emergencies, and they often need a referral from their primary care physician to see specialists. The goal is to manage healthcare costs more effectively while providing accessible, coordinated care to members.

<u>Question</u>: Before applying for the MA APCD, we wanted to determine if the medical claims LDS table included fields to determine the provider who rendered medical

care and the provider location.

### **Provider Details**



<u>Answer:</u> The data elements **MC134 Plan Rendering Provider** and **MC135 Provider Location** are included in the medical claims LDS table. Insurance carriers use these elements to describe precisely who performed the services on the patient and where the service was rendered

- ❖ The intent of MC134 Plan Rendering Provider is to capture the details of the individual that performed the service on the patient or for the patient (lab technician, supply delivery, etc.).
- The intent of MC135 Provider Location is to capture the details of the site where the Plan Rendering Provider delivered those services (Office, Hospital, etc.)
